FORT WORTH -- Fincher E. "Red" Withers Jr., a lifelong resident of Fort Worth, died peacefully Monday evening, Oct. 13, 2008. "The gentle giant has left us!" It was Red's desire that no services be held, but that he be remembered by his family and friends. For a time, Red operated River Ranch Stables in Benbrook. He was a supporter of the Golden Gloves program and will be warmly remembered by the many friends he made throughout his life.
