It was at this time that I remember her making a delicious dinner, almost all vegetables. She has ALWAYS taken good care of her physical body through a great diet and exercise. She has been such a good example and influence for good on how to take care of one’s body. She was also very in fashion. Even though she did not have a lot of money for clothes growing up, she always knew how to put an outfit together to look very cool.

During our senior year of high school, we both applied to BYU. We were both put on “hold status.” In the end we both did not get in. So Kirsten went to Ricks College (now BYU Idaho) and I went to school in California.

Kirsten is an awesome mother. She studied books, such as “Love and Logic.” She has taught me a lot about sleep patterns and children, especially with Spencer, and about how to discipline in a positive way. I never saw her yell or get angry with her children. She loves her kids. I have seen her get down to her children’s level to look them in the eyes and tell them the importance of sharing and then telling them she loved them.

She loves Brian. She was always careful to have the house clean and things taken care of with the kids and house. She tried to make life good for him, because she

loved him. She always talked fondly of him and how luck she was to have him.

She was also very supportive and encouraged Brian to get his master's degree. She talked about her husband and kids with a twinkle in her eye. They are her treasures!
