He was born May 14, 1917, to Glenn and Lillian Bryson of Shreveport, La. After suffering the loss of his father at age 7, he helped support his family by working the family farm, selling newspapers and any job that would bring money during the heart of the Great Depression. He graduated from Texas A&M College of Veterinary Medicine in 1940. After a long career in the USDA meat inspection division in Fort Worth, he retired in 1975.
