FORT WORTH -- Sister Marion Celeste Cimo, 94, a Sister of Saint Mary of Namur for 72 years, died peacefully Friday evening, Jan. 6, 2006, at Our Lady of Victory Center. ♂??? Mass of Christian Burial: 10:30 a.m. Tuesday in the chapel at Our Lady of Victory Center, 909 W. Shaw St., the Most Rev. Kevin Vann, bishop of the Diocese of Fort Worth, celebrant. Burial: Sister Marion Celeste will be laid to rest in Mount Olivet Cemetery. Visitation: She will lie in state at Our Lady of Victory Center, where a vigil service will be held at 7 p.m. Monday. ♂??? Shaw St., Fort Worth 76110. ♂??? Sister Marion Celeste, Camille Cimo, was born in Waco on April 29, 1911. Her parents, Philip Cimo and Camella De Goia, had been born in Italy. Camille was the youngest of eight children, four of whom died before her birth. Her mother died giving birth to Camille. She and her siblings were reared by her aunt, Celeste, and uncle, Marion. Camille attended Our Lady of Victory College and entered the religious life on May 27, 1933. She made her perpetual vows as Sister Marion Celeste in August 1941. ♂??? Before her retirement in 1996, Sister's teaching career extended over six decades, during which time she taught in almost all the schools staffed by the Sisters of St. Mary in Dallas, Fort Worth, Arlington, Denison, Sherman, Beaumont, Houston and Dickinson as well as Porterville and Hollister, Calif. ♂??? Her most treasured memories were those of her years in Sherman. After leaving full-

time teaching, Sister Marion Celeste continued to teach religion, tutor children and help with day care after school. ♂??? Diminutive in stature, Sister Marion Celeste brought joy wherever she lived. All the sisters treasured her spontaneous, fun-loving spirit which she shared without restraint. Gifted in improvisation, she would dance, pantomime or dramatize skits to entertain the community. For her 94th birthday, at a festive Italian supper celebration at OLV, arranged by her family, Sister danced. Her concern for other never left her, even during her last illness when she would inquire about the well-being of her nurses and visitors. ♂???
