FORT WORTH -- Elizabeth Luedke Dixon, 98, a homemaker, died Thursday, Aug. 19, 2010, at a Fort Worth retirement center, where she had been living since 2006. Elizabeth's interests included gourmet cooking, sewing and gardening. She was also involved with the Van Cliburn Piano Competition, hosting participants from around the world.
