He also was beginning his second semester as president of the college's Pharmacy Council, a student government organization with representatives from all pharmacy student organizations and academic classes. In addition, he was a former recipient of a Pharmacy Alumni Association Endowed Scholarship and had been cited numerous times for university academic
