Joe Ben joined the Marine Corps on Nov. 30, 1945, and served his country for three years, stationed in California and Texas. ♂??? Upon his discharge, he entered Texas Christian University and graduated with a bachelor of arts degree in education in 1951 and a master of arts degree from the University of North Texas in 1955. ♂??? Joe played football, basketball and baseball throughout his school years in Fort Worth and became a professional baseball player for a team in North Carolina in 1945. He continued playing baseball in the U.S. Marine Corps. ♂??? In 1951 he began his career of 32 years in public education as a teacher at East Handley School and in 1964 he served in his first administrative post with the FWISD as a elementary principal at Steven F. Austin. His administrative responsibilities continued throughout his career at Mitchell Boulevard, Benbrook Elementary and S.S. Dillow until his retirement in June 1983. He was loved and respected by all who knew and served with him, and was responsible for the education of thousands of Fort Worth students. ♂???
