Kathleen (Kathy) Marie Sears, 67, of Euless died on Thursday, November 17, 2011, holding hands with her two daughters and niece, after a courageous, yet brief brave battle with Bile Duct Cancer (Cholangiocarcinoma).

Kathy was born on January 8, 1944, in Chicago, Illinois to Leonard and Anne Schlau. She resided in Illinois until a job transfer to Texas in 1984. Kathy spent 25 years as a corporate travel agent, retired in 2010,. She had organized team travel for the Texas Rangers, the Dallas Mavericks, and Dallas Sidekicks.
