The two priorities of her life were her family and the church. She and her husband, Elmer, were very influential in the establishment of Broadview Baptist Church. They later were an important part of First Baptist Church of Smithfield. The last few years Mable had been a member of North Richland Hills Baptist Church. She taught Sunday school for children at Broadview and Smithfield for many years.
